and O He, who is not caused to err by the (multitudes of) seekers,  
and O He, who is not wearied by the insistent supplications (of beseechers).

Grant me the coolness of Your pardon,

and the sweetness of Your Mercy.

(This Dua may be recited after daily Salaat.)

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This is the Dua of Hadrath Khidr that he recited while clinging to the curtain of the Kaabah. Imam Ali A.S. while making tawaaf heard this and asked him if it was his Dua. He said yes. Khidr asked him to recite at the end of every daily prayer, saying that If a faithful recites this Dua, Allah forgives all sins, even if they are the equal to the heavenly stars in number, or pebbles of earth in abundance. Ameerul Mumineen A.S. said he had the knowledge of it and Allah is infinite in Beneficience. At this Hadrath Khidr exclaimed, "Of all those who have been given the knowledge, there is one who has the most knowledge."
